

Contents of EB Baby Box

| | Products | Purpose | Quantity |
|----|---|---|----------------------------|
| 1 | Mepitel One 10cm x 18cm | To apply underneath ECG leads, to protect skin – if monitoring is required. | 1 box = 10 sheets |
| 2 | Mepitel 10cm x 18cm | Primary dressing /contact layer dressing | 2 boxes = 20 |
| 3 | Urgotul 10cm x 40cm | Primary dressings / contact layer | 2 boxes = 20 |
| 4 | Mepilex Lite 15cm x 15cm | Primary or secondary dressing | 2 boxes = 10 |
| 5 | Mepilex Transfer 15cm x 20 cm | Primary or secondary dressing. Exudate transfer dressing | 2 boxes = 10 |
| 6 | Mepiform 10cm x 18cm | Securing tape or skin protection for NGT/ETT | 1 box = 5 |
| 7 | Mepitac Tape 2cm x 3m | For securing devices and dressings | 1 roll |
| 8 | Mepitel Film 6cm x 7cm | Securing tape for IV Cannula | 1 box = 10 |
| 9 | Tubifast (green) Tubifast (red) | Securing tubular bandage | 1 box = 10m 1 box = 10m |
| 10 | Intrasite conformable 10cm x 10cm | For nappy area | 1 box = 10 |
| 11 | Polymem Non-Adhesive roll 20cm x 60cm | Primary dressing | 2 rolls |
| 12 | Hypafix tape 2.5cm x 10m (Only to secure to Polymem NOT for use on skin) | To secure Polymem to itself | 1 each |
| 13 | Niltac spray (SMAR – Silicone medical adhesive remover) | To gently remove anything that is stuck to the skin to prevent further damage | 1 each |
| 14 | Mepitel 10cm x 18cm | Primary dressing /contact layer dressing | 2 boxes = 20 |

| | Products | Purpose | Quantity |

| 1 | Glad wrap | To cover wounds while preparing dressings to prevent air reaching wounds and causing pain. | 1 packet |
| 2 | Cornflour | To dry out blisters once lanced and drained. Not to apply on open wounds. | 1 box |
| 3 | Pigeon Cleft Palate Feeding Bottle and teats | May be needed if having trouble establishing a suck with breast feeding. Less chance of oral trauma/blister formation, soft silicone teat and easy flow. | |

| 1 | Handle with care stickers or print out | To alert those coming into contact with the baby. |
| 2 | "The newborn with suspected EB" leaflet | Information for the parents. |
| 3 | Mission Statement of National EB Baby Boxes (includes contact details of centres of expertise and the website for accurate biopsy sampling information) | For hospital staff. |
| 4 | National EB Dressings Scheme application form | For hospital staff to begin the application process (all babies get provisional approval subject to proof of diagnosis). Must be registered with Medicare. |
| 5 | "How to handle me" picture | Diagram to demonstrate how to handle baby safely. |
| 6 | Recommended Care Information | Information on principles of care for neonates with suspected EB. |
